## STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of Horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all Horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- requiring that Horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and Competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own Horses as well as Horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of Horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; 2022 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section D Page vii
- requiring owners, trainers and Competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the Horse.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

## THE RULE BOOK

Exhibitors, Judges and Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Full details of Horse Show operation (EC (including F.E.I.) rules, list of recognized Judges) and other vital information is in the RULE BOOK copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments.

- Membership in Equestrian Canada is now called a Sport License.
- All Exhibitors, owners, trainers, riders, drivers, handlers must join EC with a Sport License to compete in any EC sanctioned show.
- When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC Shows for EC Awards.
- The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this Prize List.
- Amateur Competitors: All seniors competing in EC Amateur Classes require a current Amateur card. This must be applied for at the same time as the Sport License through Equestrian Canada. Amateur status is included in the license but must be checked off on the application for it to show up on the Sport Horse license.
- Bronze License - \$33.00 Silver License - \$117.00 Gold License - \$195.00 Platinum License - \$294.00
- An EC Bronze Sport License is the minimum required for the 2023 Aurora Summer Horse Show. Amateur status may apply. Visit [www.equinecanada.ca](http://www.equinecanada.ca) to obtain sport license information.
- A Temporary Sport License is NOT available for purchase at a Bronze Show such as the Aurora Summer Horse Show. A minimum of a Bronze license must be purchased in advance of the show.
- Regional & National Breed Shows require a Silver EC Sport License EC Article B1302.2
- A Provincial Membership from Alberta Equestrian Federation is mandatory before purchasing an Equestrian Canada (EC) Sport License. Annual AEF memberships are available for \$52.50 for an individual membership. AEF members are automatically protected with a \$5,000,000. liability insurance policy.

## BIOSECURITY RISK

Equine vaccination requirements are outlined and mandatory as specified in the Prize List and on the Entry Form because communicable equine diseases are a serious concern.

- Equestrian Canada strongly discourages sharing of water buckets, feed, hoses, or manure removal equipment and recommends limiting horse to horse contact unless animals are already cohabitators of the same barn premises.
- If a horse presents any signs of illness, notify the Show Manager immediately.
- The Show Manager will provide contact information for the Veterinarian on Call as well as local veterinary clinics.
- A designated isolation stall will be allocated should isolation be deemed necessary.
- The horse should NOT be sent home without Show Management being notified.

In the event of an emergency, illness or crisis at our Show, protocols are in place and members of our incident Team are aware of the Emergency Action Plan and their responsibilities as they pertain to the Plan.

**“Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book” (A602.2)**

**\*\*PLEASE READ\*\* PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE** The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person(s) responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. AHA602 A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse of the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. Section A Page 101 B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competition

**ENTRY: Closing date for Entries - May 25, 2023**

**NOTE:** Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. (A602.7) Any Horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)

**All entry forms must:**

1. have each horse entered on one entry form
2. full addresses of owner, trainer, rider and/or authorized agent
3. signature of owner, rider/handler, trainer or authorized agent) & the adult person responsible
4. copies of all membership cards, this includes AHA, & EC/AEF (PSO) for owner, rider/handler, trainer (adults and juniors)
5. a copy of each horse's registration papers (front and back)
6. payment for classes, stall rental, drug fees, AHA fees and other fees shown on the entry form must be sent with the entry form on a cheque or a copy of the e-transfer
7. Reminder that the competition Back Number must be always worn and visible.

**E-TRANSFER** a) The E-transfer must be completed prior to mailing or emailing the entry to Aurora Offsite Show.

b) Make a copy of the confirmed E-transfer and attach it to the entry form. A copy must be with the mailed or emailed entry giving confirmation of payment on the entries.

c) Please type or print your name on the E-Transfer in the "box" on the e-transfer transaction.

**HELMET RULES:** EC Article A905.2 states that Junior competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI, is also acceptable. EC Article A905.1 strongly recommends that all persons wear approved headgear at all times while mounted or driving cross country or marathon. However, at present, if a Junior is competing in a discipline or breed whose rules specify other headgear (e.g. western hats, derbies etc) those rules supersede the new rule. However, all breeds and disciplines do allow protective headgear with no penalty and we urge their members to put safety ahead of tradition and adopt the new rule. Therefore, no helmets are mandatory as yet in Saddle Seat or Western classes but they are recommended. Approved headgear is mandatory in all over fences classes. Hunt Seat on the flat must wear approved helmets complete with harness. "Note: A helmet is required in Hunt Seat Equitation as per EC rules. Juniors are strongly advised to wear helmets until just before they enter the show ring in any division.

## IMPORTANT EQUINE VACCINATION RULING

### Equine Canada Ruling on Vaccination

IMPORTANT ARTICLE A602 -- MANDATORY INFORMATION "All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.

ARTICLE A802 ENTRY FORMS (7.) the following statement, must be signed by the person(s) responsible: "I hereby certify that every horse listed on this entry form has met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations".

### KNOW YOUR VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

#### EQUINE INFLUENZA & HERPES VACCINATIONS AT EC SANCTIONED COMPETITIONS



#### WHO?

- All equines entering in Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions as of 2020



#### WHAT?

- Equine Influenza Vaccination
- Equine Herpes Virus 1 & 4 Vaccination



#### WHEN?

- Primary vaccinations must be given in accordance with manufacturer recommendations
- Boosters vaccinations must be provided annually (every 12 months) thereafter
- Vaccination must be administered within 6 months (plus 21 days) of ARRIVING at the competition
- BUT NOT within 7 days (1 week before) of arrival to the competition
- MAKE A PLAN WITH YOUR VET!



#### HOW?

- EC will require that all responsible persons must declare compliance with vaccination requirements on their entry form
- Individual competitions can require proof of vaccination
- Proof of vaccination can be in the form of a veterinarian's receipt or invoice
- If you administer your own vaccinations, you must provide a receipt, batch number, and date of administration
- ALWAYS CARRY YOUR PROOF OF VACCINATION WITH YOU!

**ARTICLE A602 PRIZE LISTS – MANDATORY INFORMATION (8.)** The following statement must be included in the prize list of any EC sanctioned competition: "All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."

**ARTICLE A802 ENTRY FORMS (7.)** All entry forms must contain the following statement, which must be signed by the person(s) responsible (See Glossary – Person(s) responsible): "I hereby certify that every horse listed on this entry form has met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations."
